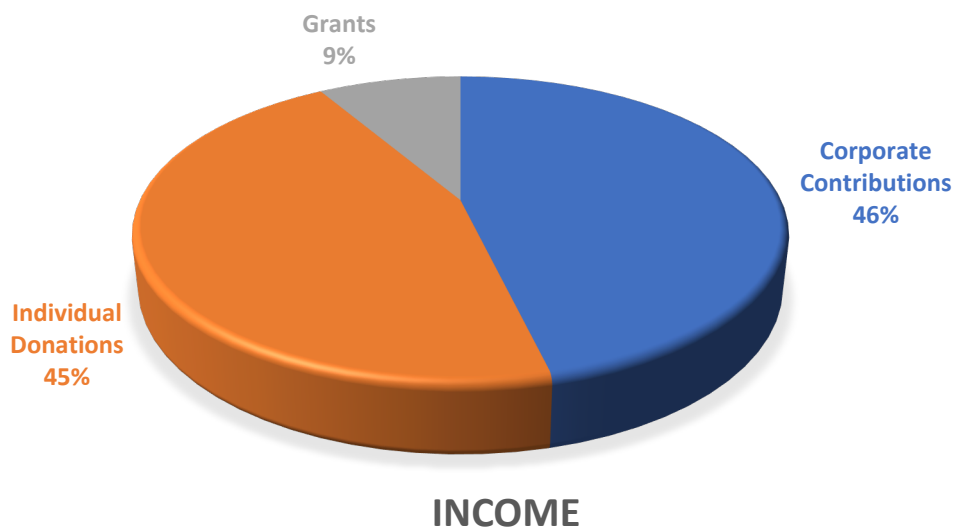

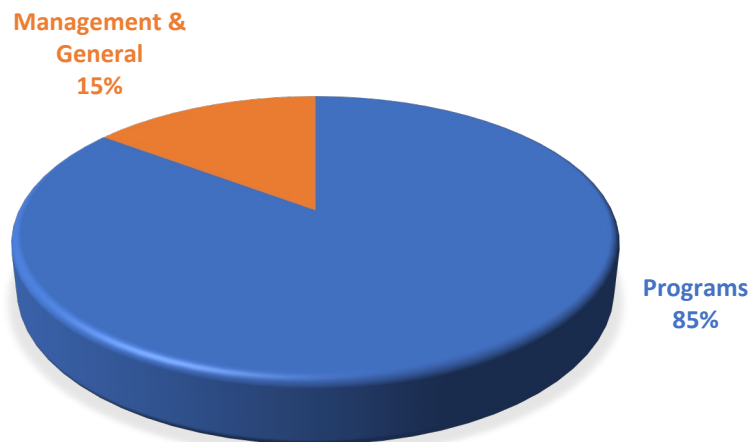
L4 Cares Income

L4 Cares Expenses

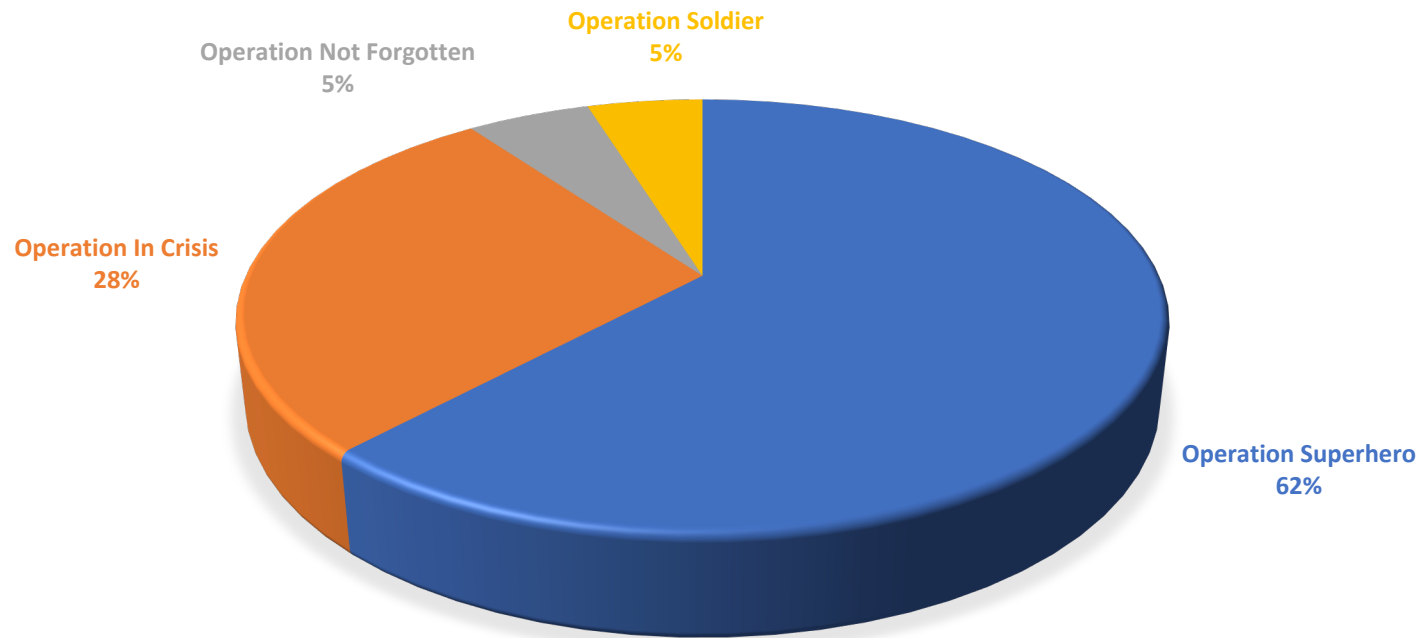

During our fall pilot event, a precious six-year-old girl ran up to our founder and hugged her leg. Through the little girls tears she shared that her baby brother was at home dying, it broke our heart. The feedback we received from our pilot program last September was amazing and it fueled our ultimate vision, as described below.

Our ultimate dream and vision for L4 Cares is to have a fun and therapeutic retreat for families who have a child battling a terminal illness. A facility where they can be a normal kid for a day or two with their families, without worrying about large crowds. Our wish is to purchase or lease 10-15 acres of beautiful land in the area.

With several small cabins, a fishing pond, petting zoo, miniature golf, princesses & superheroes, a stage for entertainment, a garden, campfires, craft rooms, playground, great food, treats and gifts, ever lasting memories are sure to be had.

Often times these sweet children are not able to travel far from where they are receiving treatment and need to be near a hospital. A long trip to Disney or other like venues are many times not possible.

Our goal would be to include nursing home residents, veterans and others experiencing a crisis. Ultimately bringing our four points of focus together at one venue. During a city emergency, our cabins can be used as cooling/warming centers and a place to provide warm food and a whole lot of love.
